Accra, Ghana Trip Information for 2021 Volunteers/Interns

- 1. Local host accommodation and on ground logistics in Accra, Ghana will be provided for all international volunteers/Interns by Mzuzah (volunteers are free to pay for other preferred accommodation of their choice. Several global brand hotels such as the Marriot and Holiday Inn Hotels are available in Accra, Ghana)
- 2. Tickets to & from Accra, Ghana are the sole responsibility of each volunteer/intern. Approximate cost is between \$1000 & \$1500. We suggest British Airways or Delta Airlines. We will communicate exact dates and itinerary. Remember to include travel insurance to cover your trip and medical coverage, typical range is \$50 to \$70.

Typical Volunteer Tasks During Mzuzah Trips

Volunteer/Intern tasks during the Mzuzah trip include:

- Basic medical care/Interventions such as annual medical/dental checkup's for orphan children.
- Key role in reviewing project write ups presented by underserved university students. Making recommendations for project improvements, strategic positioning and formal presentations.
- Engaging local entrepreneurial start ups by sharing possible solutions to their current issues.
- Hands on volunteer activities at local orphanages and other underserved community projects.
- Rapporteur @ the Mzuzah Convergence.
- Preparing program evaluation report for program.
- Other program event tasks as the need arises on ground.
